2024 Crime Report

- Annual Crime Report created to report and compare crime statistics for the Ellensburg Police Department.
- Utilized National Incident Based Reporting System (NIBRS) data for this report, using standardized definitions and reporting procedures, which allow for local comparisons.
- NIBRS data is a snapshot of data taken April 2025 covering the previous 12 months. Non-NIBRS data presented in this report is for calendar year 2024.
- This report details calls and criminal activity within the City of Ellensburg.

2024 Crime Report

Summary of Washington State Crime Data for 2024

In 2024, Washington State's population rose to 8,035,515 residents. Number of commissioned law enforcement officers remains very low at 1.38 per 1000 population, with the national per capita rate averaging 2.31 officers.

Key crime statistics for 2024 include:

- Murders: The state recorded 312 murders, marking a decrease of 18.8% from 2023.
- Crimes Against Persons showed a **decrease** of 0.8% with 110,065 offenses reported; compared to 110,989 offenses reported in 2023.
- Crimes Against Property showed a **decrease** of 13.4% with 308,506 offenses reported; compared to 356,438 offenses reported in 2023.
- Crimes Against Society showed an **increase** of 31.0% with 27,973 offenses reported; compared to 21,360 offenses reported in 2023.
- Violent Crimes showed a **decrease** of 7.6% with 29,036 offenses reported; compared to 31,441 offenses reported in 2023
- In the category of Crimes Against Property, the three offense types with the highest percentage are Larceny-Theft with 44.6%, Destruction of Property with 21.4%, and Motor Vehicle Theft with 11.0%.
- Juveniles comprised 5.6% of the total arrests.

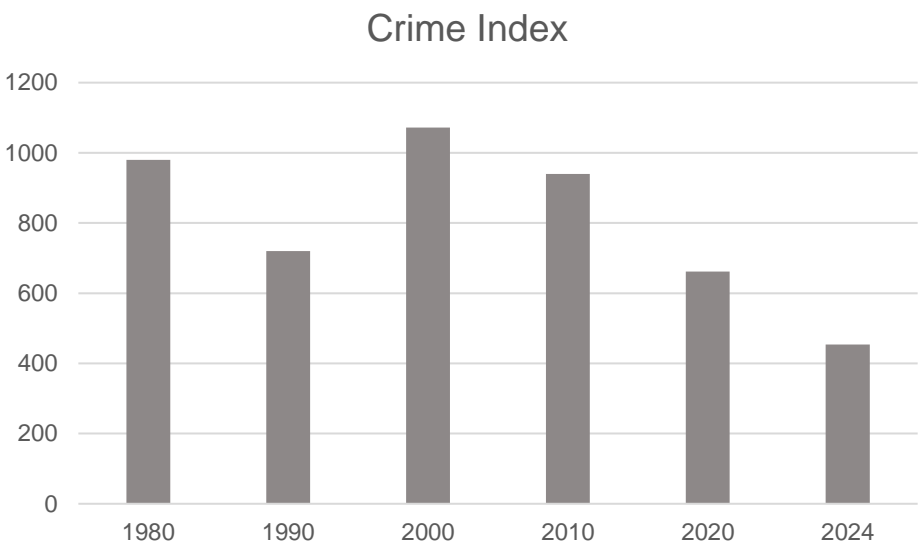
Ellensburg at a glance:

- Ellensburg 2024 population estimated 20,970 (OFM)
- Handled 16,018 calls in 2024, 879 fewer than 2023, a 5% reduction
- Reported 1183 NIBRS crimes. A 11% decrease over 2023
- Made 447, Group A, NIBRS related arrests, a 12% decrease from 2023
- Crimes Against Persons, Ellensburg down 6%, Statewide down .8%
- Crimes Against Property, Ellensburg down 20%, Statewide down 13.4%
- Crimes Against Society, Ellensburg up 30%, Statewide up 31%.
- **Concerning crime categories noted during 2023 Crime Report, 2024 results:**
 - Rape: 15 in 2023, 16 in 2024. 6%
 - Juvenile Crime Arrests: 92 in 2023, 74 in 2024. -20%
 - Motor vehicle theft: 48 in 2023, 14 in 2024. -70%
 - Domestic Offenses: 206 in 2023, 176 in 2024. -15%
- Crime rate decreased to the lowest level since reporting NIBRS data to 56.4, an 11% decrease compared to 2023
- Since implementing evidence-based policing strategy in 2022, Ellensburg's crime rate has been reduced 28%

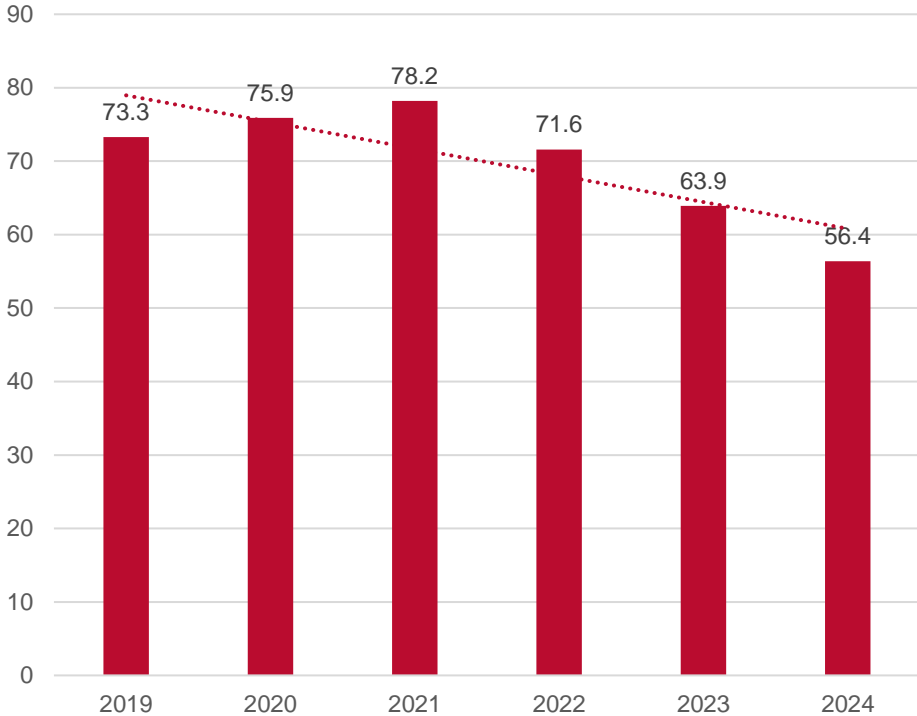

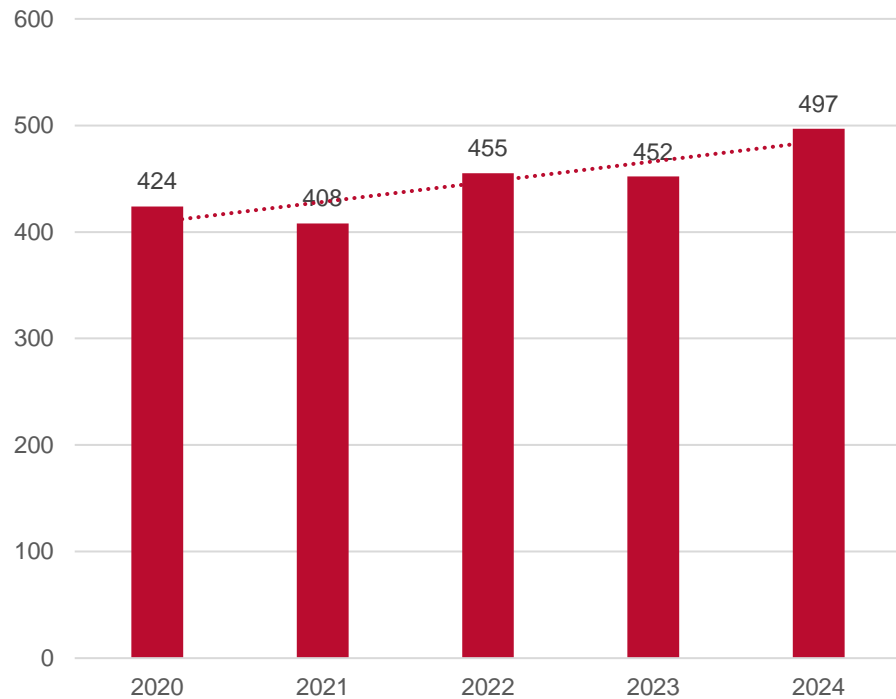

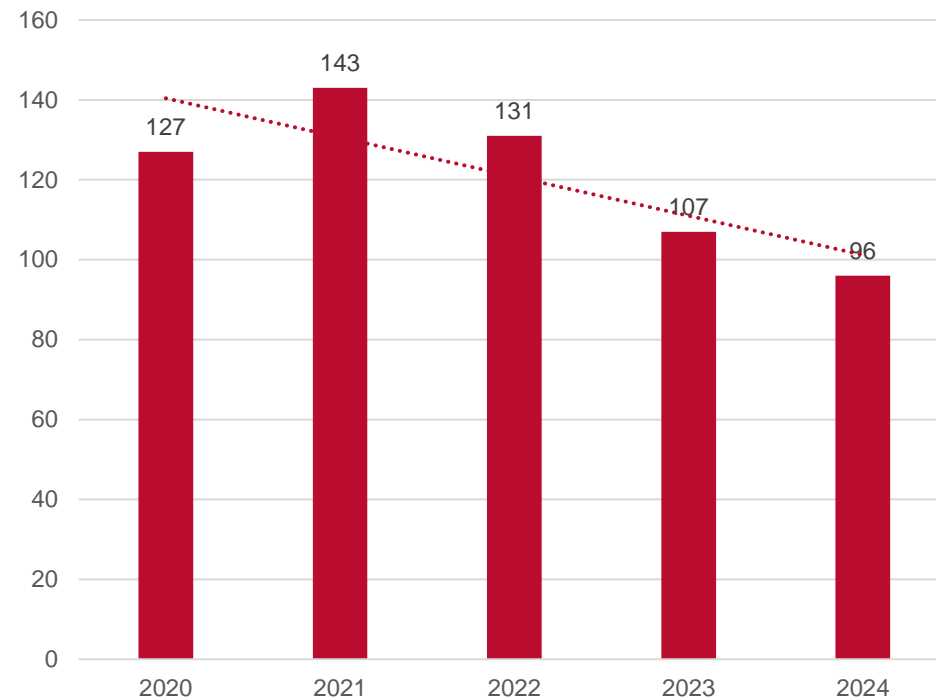

Mental Health Referrals

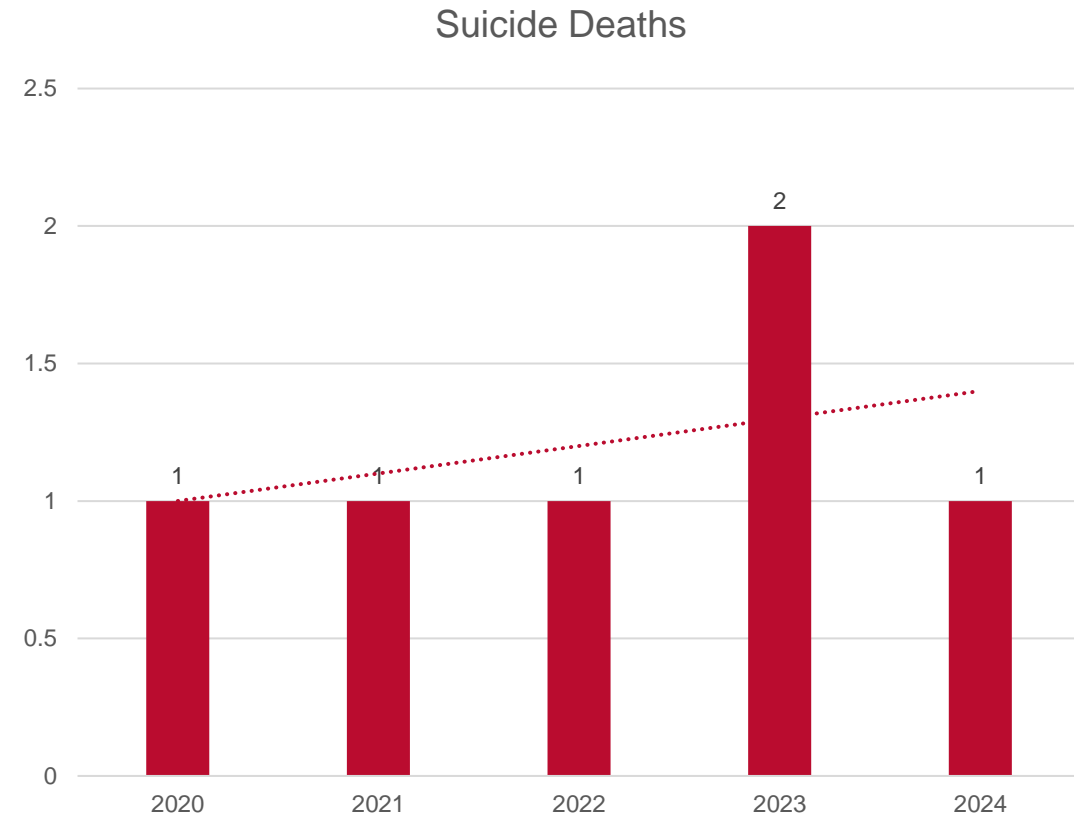
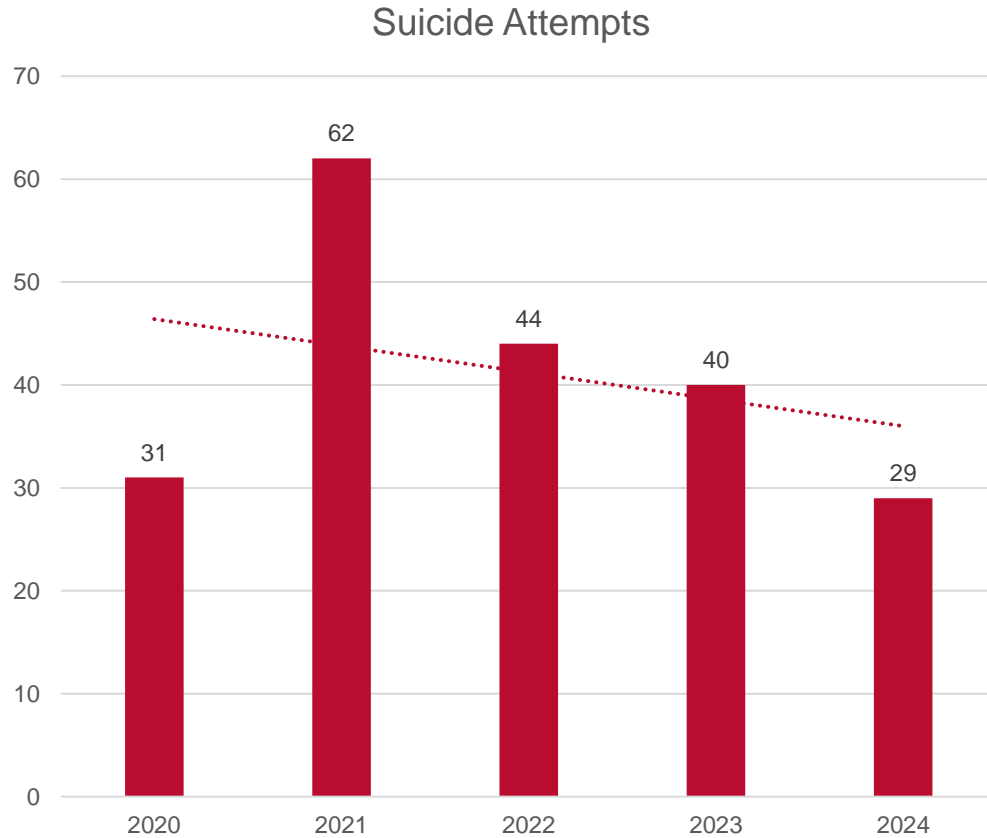


Suicidal Calls



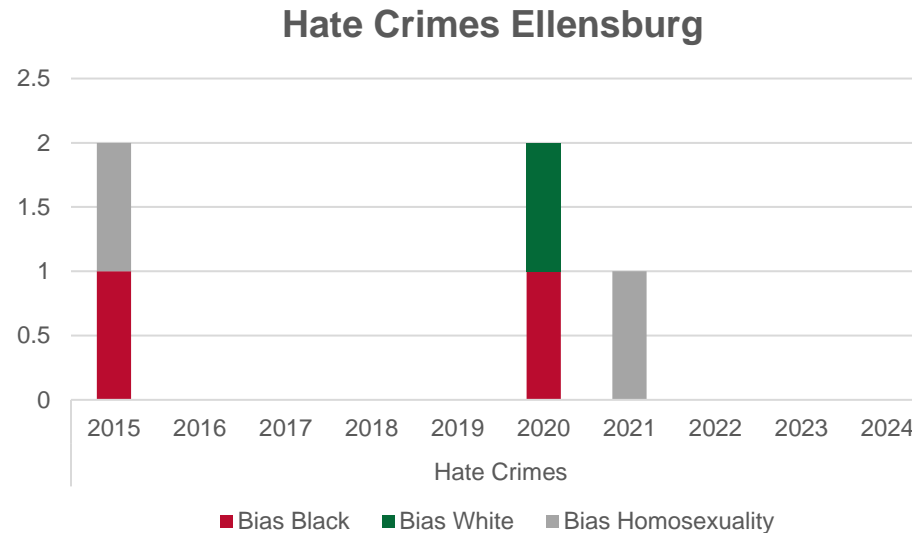

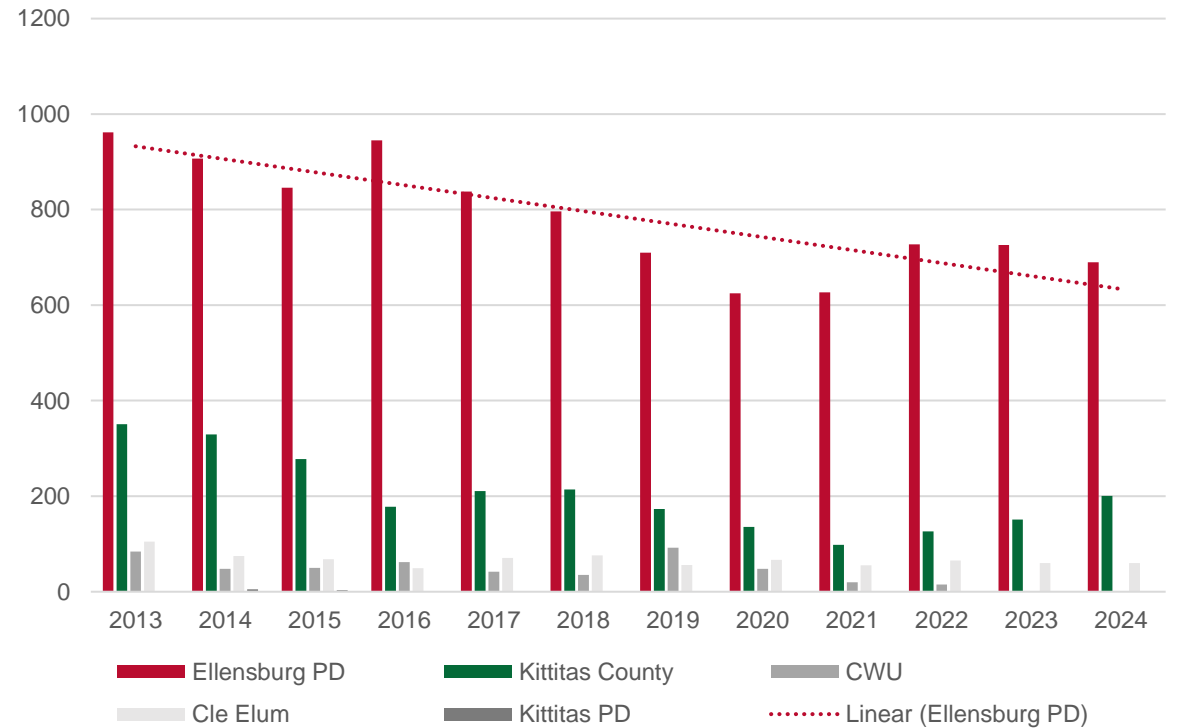

Precision Policing

Implemented mid-2022, this method aims to enhance our community's well-being through precise, effective, and efficient law enforcement strategies, focusing on where they are most needed.

Key Aspects of Precision Policing:

- **Data-Driven Decision-Making:** Utilizing crime/call data and analysis to identify the root cause of crime and quality of life issues.
- **Focused Deterrence:** Understanding the cause of crime better prepares the department to focus on enforcement and prevention strategies, changing the environment that supports criminal behavior
- **Community Engagement:** Through our annual community survey, social media, conversations, and presentations, we learn what concerns our community.
- **Technology Integration:** This is a key element of a successful evidence-based strategy. Being able to analyze the mountains of data allows for the proper identification of the problem and to measure our progress requires appropriate new tools and technology.

Precision Policing

Benefits to the Ellensburg Community:

- **Increased Safety:** By concentrating resources where they are most needed, we aim to reduce crime rates and enhance public safety.
- **Efficient Use of Resources:** Ensures taxpayer funds are used effectively, promoting fiscal responsibility.

- **Programs:** Development of programs to address crime and victimization from all angles, utilizing information, training, partnerships, non-enforcement compliance and enforcement strategies to make Ellensburg a safe community.

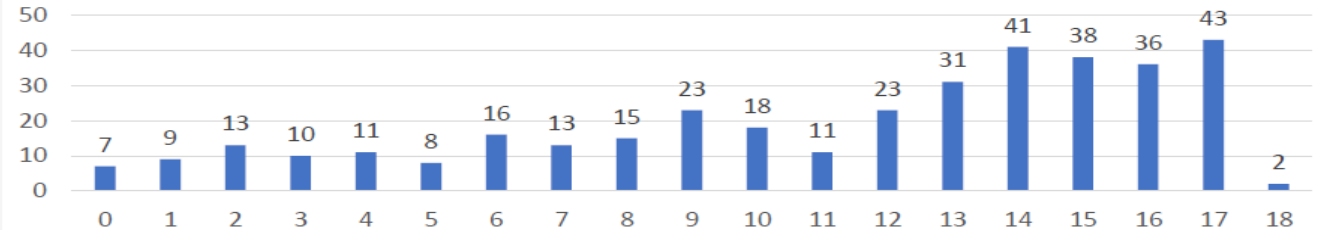

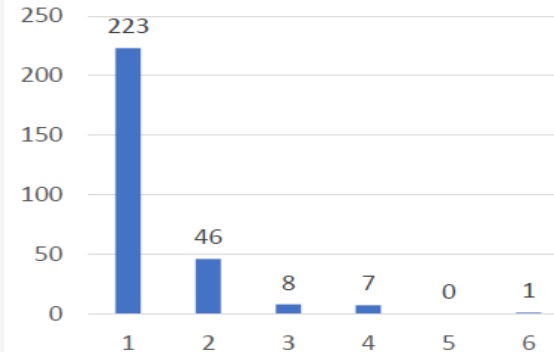

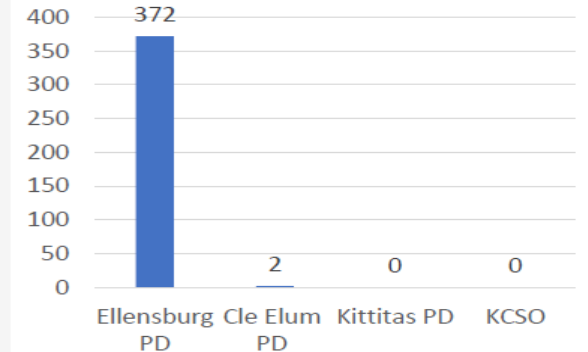
Count by Age

COMMUNITY SURVEY RESULTS: YOUTH/CHILD RELATED CONCERNS

- 2025- Requested EPD Presentation/Training Topics: Gang Violence & Mitigation, Internet Safety, Bullying Prevention, Self-Advocation Techniques
- 2024- Strengthen community awareness about issues that impact children and adolescents:
 - Internet exploitation
 - Cyber-bullying
 - Mental health concerns
 - Gang recruitment/association
 - Drug abuse

High Density Residential Call Project

- Partnered with local apartment management
- Met with residents and developed a survey to better understand their perspective of safety
- Met with representatives from successful apartment management groups to identify best-practice protocol
- Interviewed past president of rental association to better understand business side of apartment management
- Increase community resources to educate residents on resources and support organizations available in Ellensburg
- Fostering inclusive activities between different age-cohorts to expel stereo-typing and ostracizing
- Provide aggregated report of complaints to inform residents on common rule violations and managements response without identifying specific incidents or resident names

BY YEAR

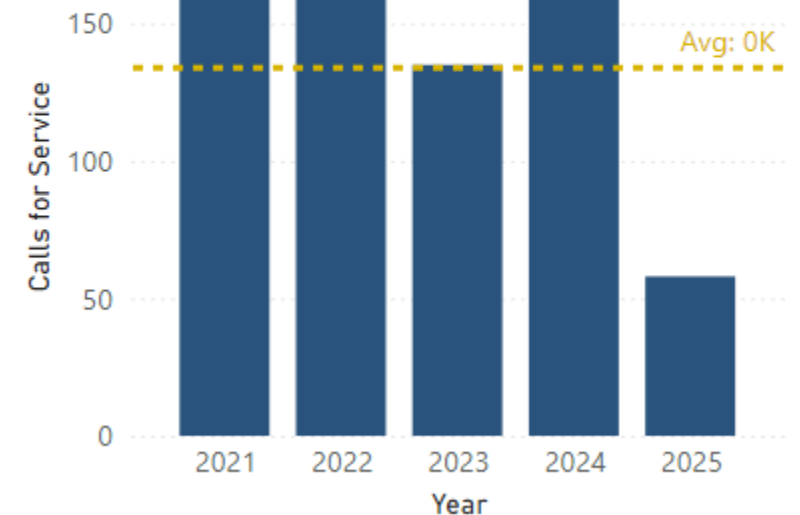


Chart represents January – June of each year

Community Engagement Project:

- Review of call data identified an increase in number of alarm calls over the first 9 months of 2024
- Identified top call locations, sent letters informing of problem; provided best practices; and offered continuing support
- 9 of the top 10 took immediate action and corrected false alarm problem
- Followed up with businesses, meeting in person to discuss solutions
- Continue to closely monitor false alarms and work with responsible individuals to fix recurring issues

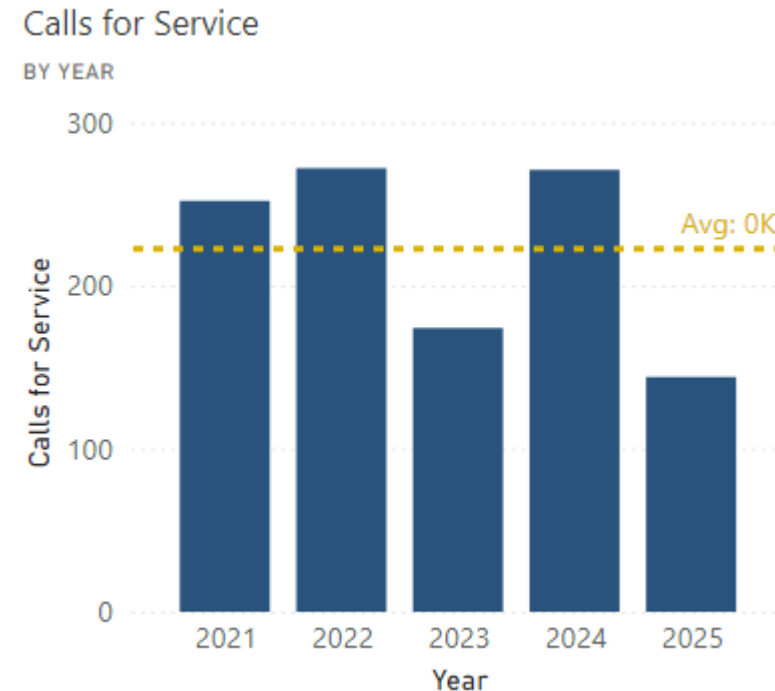


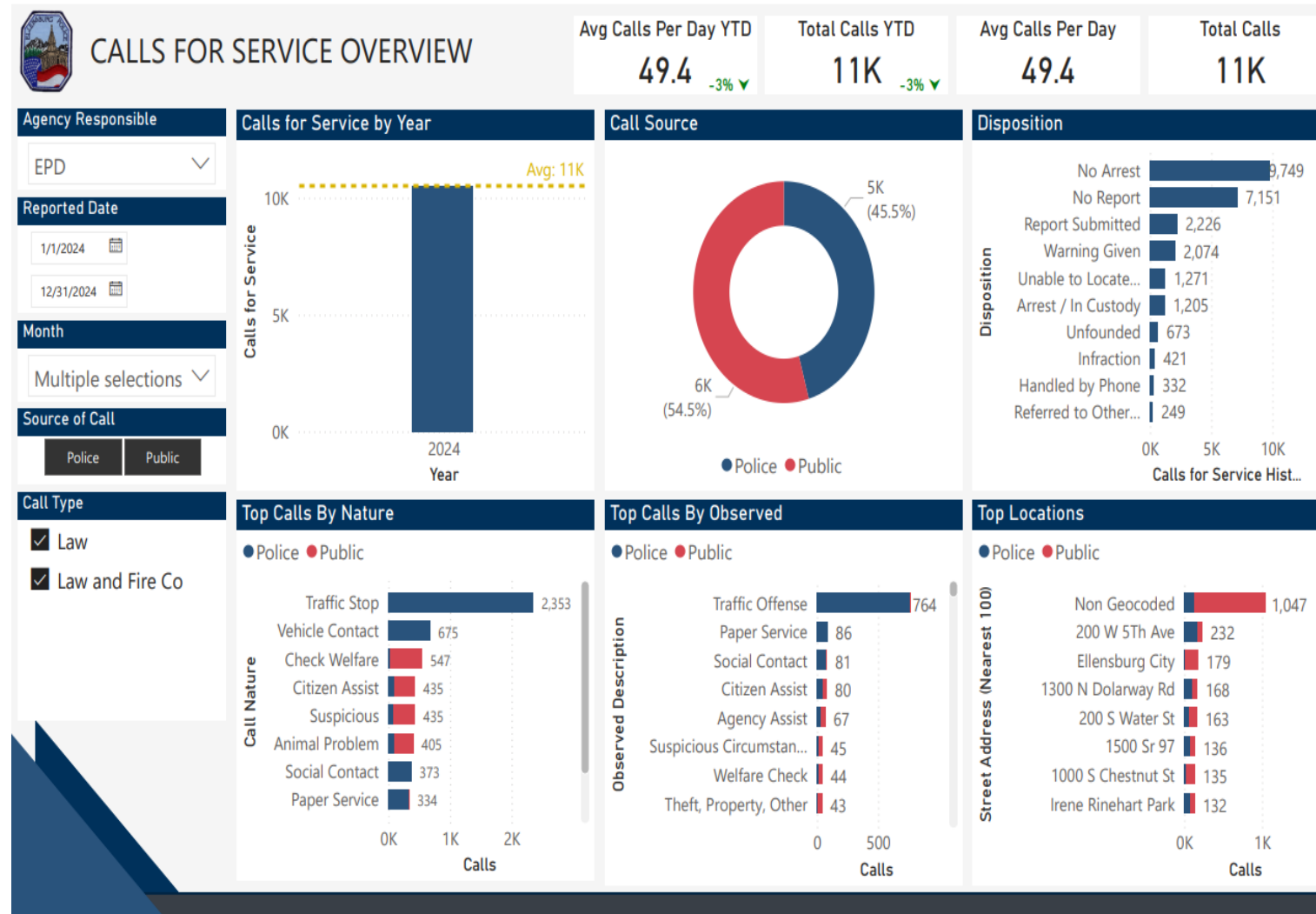

Criminal Analysis Sharing Project:

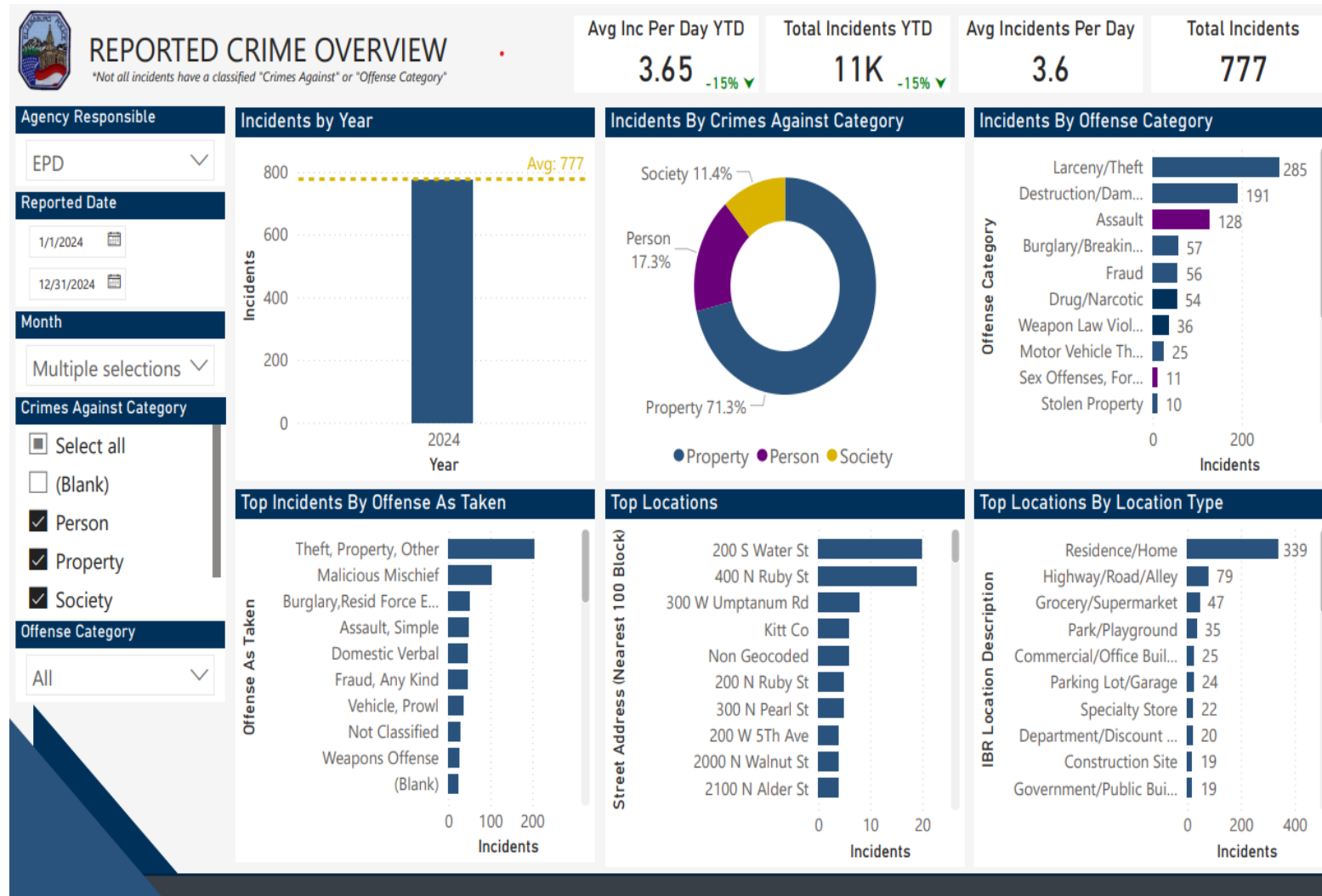
- Information gathered and analyzed regarding increase of gang related activity/crimes throughout Kittitas County.
- Met representatives from the local schools, juvenile probation, and law enforcement partners to discuss how to address data collection, reporting, and assessment, to determine crime mitigation response.
- Results of this project has gathered attention and was presented to law enforcement and prosecutors in Yakima and Spokane Counties, at their request, to assist with their gang problems.
- Officers and Analyst attend and share local intelligence regionally.
- Information is utilized during community meetings and training.
- We continue to develop both deterrent and enforcement responses.
